Statement of Significance

The house was built in 1928 in a design by Joseph Wohleb for fellow architect Frank Stanton. The house was also owned in its early years by Harry Born, manager of Kaufman/Leonard Furniture Company located at the corner of Legion and Franklin in downtown Olympia. Although the house has been extensively remodeled on the west side, the front facade remains nearly intact.

Description of Physical Appearance

Approached by a circular driveway, the Stanton House is a rectangular, two-story wood frame structure built in the Foursquare style on a poured concrete foundation. The hip roof is covered with wood shingles and terminates in a plain boxed cornice with a wide soffit; walls are clad with clapboards. A one-story hip-roofed extension along the north wall, originally an open porch, has a recessed porch at its northeast front corner which shelters the entry door. A new one-story addition extends to the rear and leads to a large deck overlooking Budd Inlet. Fenestration consists of double-hung windows, some in groups of two and three, with one-over-one lights and plain surrounds with projecting head moldings.
