Statement of Significance This stucco bungalow was built in 1922 by George Raymond, a local builder for his own home. Raymond also built the Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Lacey.

Description of Physical Appearance Perched prominently above the street on a rise overlooking Budd Inlet, the Raymond House is a rectangular, one-and-one-half-story stucco bungalow on a poured concrete foundation. Its front-gabled roof is covered with composition shingles and has wide overhangs with exposed rafters, and wide gable-end fascia boards. A gable-roofed entry porch offset on the front (west) gable has low brick walls and piers with tapered wooden columns supporting a wide segmental arch, above which is a small gable window with mullions in a sunburst pattern. The front facade features two tripartite picture windows with decorative mullions in their upper sash, and other windows are single and paired double-hung sash with plain surrounds.
