Statement of Significance A prominent pioneer style home along East 4th, the structure has had a number of owners throughout the years. Records indicate that it was built about 1890 by Edwin James.

Description of Physical Appearance The James House is a rectangular, one-and-one-half-story wood frame structure built in the Pioneer style. Its tall gable roof is covered with composition shingles and broken by gabled dormers on the east and west facades. The front (north) gable is ornamented with a decorative truss of turned posts. Walls are clad with clapboards, and the front gable is clad with alternating bands of square and fishscale shingles. A porch with a shallow shed roof and square posts wraps around the front and side facades, sheltering the paneled main entry door; adjacent to the door is a tripartite double-hung window the one-over-one lights. Other fenestration is single and paired double-hung sash with similar lights. An extension with a lower gable roof extends to the rear.
