Statement of Significance A fine example of an English Revival style, the house was built in 1926 in a Tumwater Lumber Mills design of precut lumber for the H. J. Maury family. Maury was a prominent Olympia banker who came to Washington in 1909. A graduate of the University of Cincinnati in 1906, he was vice-president of the Security Bank in Olympia in 1925-56, president of the Bank of Winlock 1913-27 and also president of the Bank of Wilkeson. The house was owned by Dr. Frank Rotchford for many years. Listed on the Olympia Heritage Register.

Description of Physical Appearance The Maury House is a rectangular, two-story wood frame structure built in restrained English Revival style on a poured concrete foundation. The hipped and gabled roof is covered with composition shingles and has close eaves; its long south slope is broken by a full-width shed-roofed dormer. Walls are clad with wood shingles, and a brick chimney rises on the north facade. Below the steep front (west) gable is a hip-roofed porch which shelters the arched main entry door. At the northeast rear corner is a partially recessed porch sheltering another entry door. Fenestration is double-hung sash with eight-over-one lights, and a hip-roofed rear extension has glass block windows. Extensive renovation of the house was done by Mary Ellen McKain and Clyde McBrayer.
