Statement of Significance

Built about 1904 the building has always been a grocery store with a residence on the second floor. The building had a porch across the front where horses were tied up and later had a gas canopy. The interior is relatively unaltered.

Description of Physical Appearance

This is a rectangular, two-story wood frame structure of utilitarian design, resting on a poured concrete foundation. Its hip roof is covered with composition shingles, and walls are clad with clapboards, with newer shakes on the storefront. Broad steps lead up the central entry on the front (east) facade, which is flanked by plate glass windows and topped by a flat-roofed canopy with square posts. The second story retains the original single and paired double-hung sash with one-over-one lights. A shed-roofed extension spans the rear facade.
