**Statement of Significance** An early church in Olympia, the West Side Chapel was organized in 1891 by Rev. J. C. Douglas. It was once located at Paige and Conger streets. In 1912 James F. Brabazon came to Olympia from Everett and formed in 1913 the West Side Chapel Congregation affiliated with the Christian and Missionary Alliance. He was succeeded by Rev. J. C. Baker. The church built this building in 1918.

**Description of Physical Appearance** The Westside Chapel is a rectangular, one-story wood frame structure of simple Craftsman style on a concrete foundation and full basement. Its gable roof is covered with composition shingles and has wide bracketed eaves, exposed rafters and wide gable-end fascia boards. Broad concrete steps with metal pipe railings lead up to the double main entry doors offset on the front (east) facade. Above the entry is a square gable-roofed bell tower with rectangular, louvered openings. To the right of the doors is a tripartite double-hung window with one-over one lights. The side walls are lit by rows of double-hung sash with similar lights, below which are paired multi-paned basement windows.
