#### Statement of Significance

Built in 1922 in a design by William Westbrook for Edward Dohm, the house is one of the most outstanding on the West Side. Dohm, a native of Seattle was educated at the University of Washington and came to Olympia in 1909. He was field engineer for the Department of Public Lands and was City of Olympia Engineer and City Commissioner. He had an outstanding military career beginning with the National Guard in Seattle in 1904 and he was captain of engineers during World War One in Europe. He attained the rank of Brigadier General in the Washington National Guard. He was the first commander of the American Legion Post in Olympia and a prominent member of the Rotary, Elks and head of the 238th Coastal Artillery Unit and 205th Coastal Anti-aircraft unit in Olympia. Listed on the Olympia Heritage Register.

### Description of Physical Appearance

Obscured by tall shrubbery and trees, the Dohm House is a spacious, rectangular wood frame structure of one-and-one-half stories, built in the Dutch Colonial style on a poured concrete foundation. Its bellcast gambrel roof is covered with composition shingles and has close eaves; it has small shed-roofed dormers across the rear. Walls are clad with clapboards, with wide frieze boards below the eaves. The offset front gable has a bellcast pent roof across its base, which is broken by a small bracketed gable hood above the main entry door. Fenestration includes double-hung sash with six-over-one lights, multi-paned casements, and fanlight windows in the upper gables. Three pairs of french doors open onto the wide rear porch, which has square posts, low clapboard walls and a polygonal projection topped by a polygonal bay in the dormer. The driveway leads to a basement garage on the east facade. The shaded rear yard has a fish pond, and offers views of Capitol Lake. The house is maintained in good condition. Changes have been made to the rear kitchen and porch area.
