Statement of Significance A very old mortuary established in Olympia, the building also features unique architectural elements. The concern was begun in 1901 as the Whiteside Undertaking Company. The firm was purchased in 1909 by Hugh Sticklin and became the Sticklin Undertaking Company. In 1915 Jesse T. Mills became owner. Mills was the son of Olympia pioneer George Mills. He served as Thurston County Sheriff 1901-04, a member of the state board of control from 1904-07 and deputy state treasurer from 1907 to 1911. He was also active in many fraternal organizations. Mills' nephew Arley Mills became active in the business after World War One. L. O. Swenson purchased Jesse Mills' interest in 1943 and became sole owner after the death of Arley Mills in 1956. In 1963 Swenson sold to Dan McCaughan, a long time employee and it is now owned by his successor.

Description of Physical Appearance This is a square, two-story stucco structure on a poured concrete foundation. Its hip roof is covered with composition shingles and has wide eaves with exposed rafters. Spanning the front (west) facade is a hip-roofed porch with square columns and a wrought iron railing; the porch shelters the offset main entry door. To the right of the door, the porch has been enclosed and has multi-paned windows with central arched portions, and multi-paned arched french doors, separated by pilasters with Doric capitals. Above the porch is a second-story balcony with a low stucco wall and a flat roof with lacy wrought iron supports. Fenestration is single and paired double-hung sash with one-over-one lights. The north wall, facing the alley, has a one-story, shed-roofed bay.
