**Statement of Significance**

The distinctively designed art deco structure was built ca. 1936 and was used for many years as the Le May's Meat Market. The adjoining Capitol Park Building originally had a number of grocery businesses in a general market area.

**Description of Physical Appearance**

This is a rectangular, one-story concrete structure built in the Art Deco style. Its flat roof is bordered by an elaborate stepped parapet. The front (east) wall is clad with stucco and divided into three bays by pilasters ornamented with indented vertical lines painted a contrasting color. The wide center bay has double entry doors and a small plate glass window topped by a flat canopy, above which is a multi-paned transom. The flanking bays have plate glass windows. The south wall is also clad with stucco, and has a similar plate glass window with a multi-paned transom; it has unadorned pilasters, as does the north wall. The north wall is blank, and the rear wall has an entry door. Additional openings have been cut in the front facade.
