Statement of Significance Designed in 1938 by Joseph Wohleb for Hartman and Edna Roys, the home has not been altered and has only its second owners. Hartman Roys was supervisor of the Port of Olympia Dock and built the house to be able to see the dock and the Capitol dome. The home enjoys a good view of both.

Description of Physical Appearance This L-shaped wood frame structure is an Art Moderne era interpretation of the Colonial Revival style. It has a one-and-one-half-story rear wing on a north/south axis and an intersecting two-story front wing extending to the east. The rear gable roof and front hip roof are covered with composition shingles; at the rear is a wide shed-roofed dormer and the front wing has gabled wall dormers on the front (east) and north facades. In the corner of the "L" on the front facade, the roof extends down over a small porch sheltering the entry door. Three large plate glass windows wrap around the corners of the facade and offer views of Budd Inlet. Other fenestration is double-hung sash with multi-paned upper lights. The interior retains the original light mahogany wood work and Moderne style light fixtures.
