Statement of Significance The building was built in 1920. In 1936, Fred Anderson had an auto repair business in the building and in 1941, Armstrong motors and autos were listed at the site. Documentation is informational only.

Description of Physical Appearance Flat roofed, one story concrete building in a rectangular form. Three storefronts are in the building. The west storefront has a garage door opening, a plate-glass window topped by multi-paned clerestories. The center storefront has newer metal frame display windows, one with multi-pane clerestory. The east storefront has center vehicle bay opening and replacement display windows and a display windows with space for an entry door. 1997: Storefronts have been renovated and replaced.
