Statement of Significance Located on the east side of Olympia, the Wilman/Jackson House was built on lot 5 of Block 26 in Swan's addition to Olympia, and constructed in the Homestead style. Samuel P. and Eliza A. Wiman (sometimes spelled Wyman) bought the land in 1882. The house was built around 1890. The house changed hands a few times and was eventually purchased by Verner E. Jackson in 1927; he lived there until his death in 1980.

Description of Physical Appearance The house has the original double hung windows in 11 of 17 windows. The house also has original horizontal drop siding. Remodeling is limited to rear of house. Non-historic additions: rear addition added circa 1950, and more recent rear porch
