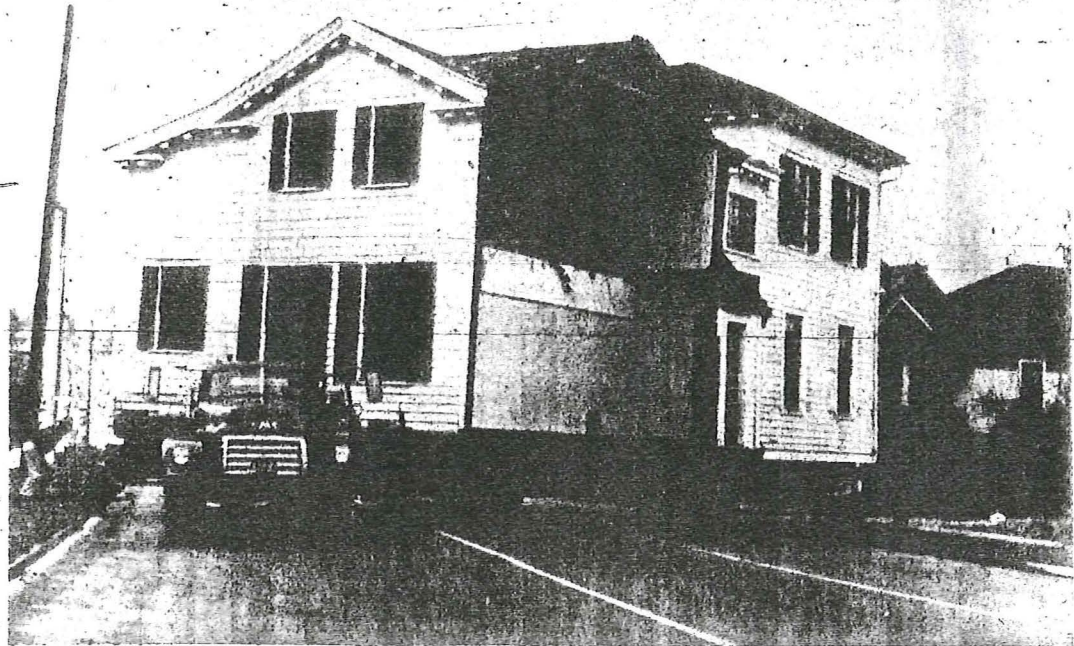

## Old Sylvester Home Moves



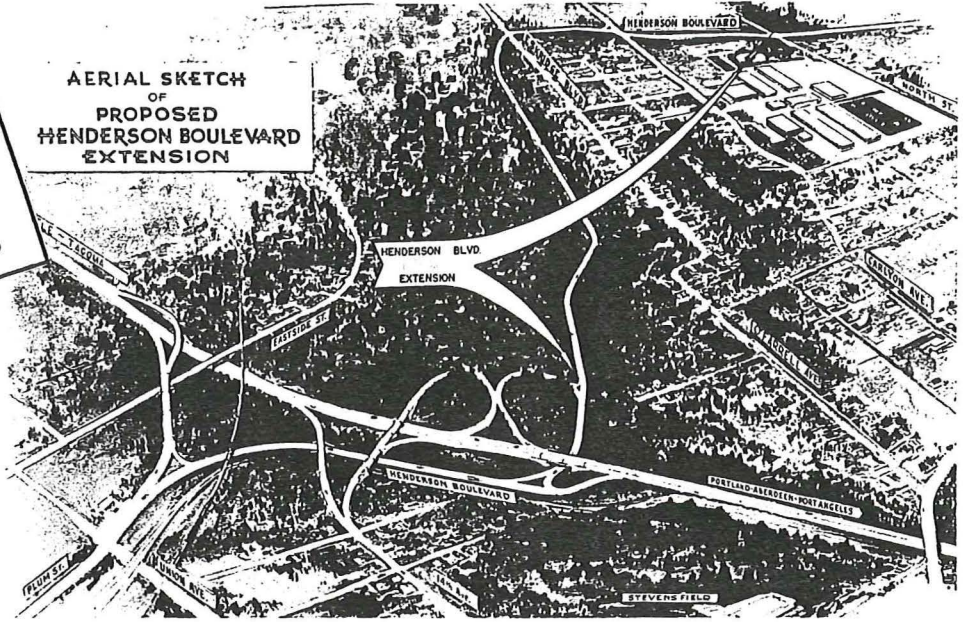
The historic old Sylvester house was eased onto its new hillside location Thursday afternoon, one month from the start of the community effort to preserve the pioneer home as a historic monument. The two-story frame building was moved from 114 Eighth Avenue East to a site on the northeast corner of State Avenue and Bethel Street, across from the Community Center. The lot was donated by Dick Lewis, Olympia automobile dealer. Two scenes of the moving project, that

started at eight o'clock Thursday morning and lasted through the afternoon, are shown in the two Daily Olympian photographs printed here. The home, built in 1856 by Edmund Sylvester, founder of Olympia, was presented to the community by Mrs. Prudence Wohleb, whose family has owned the mansion since 1859. The house was moved from its downtown location to free the property for commercial use.

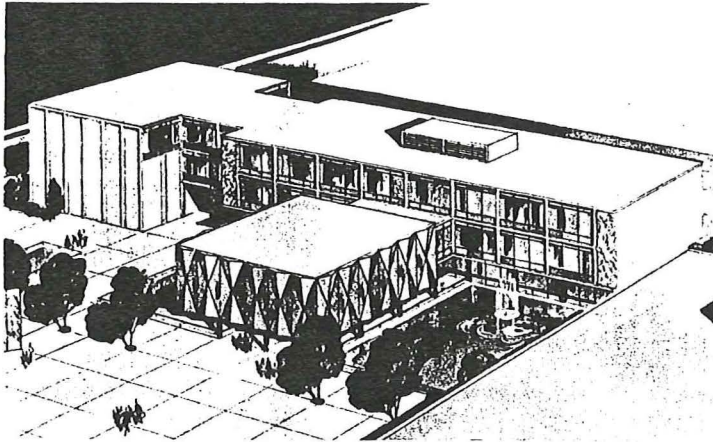

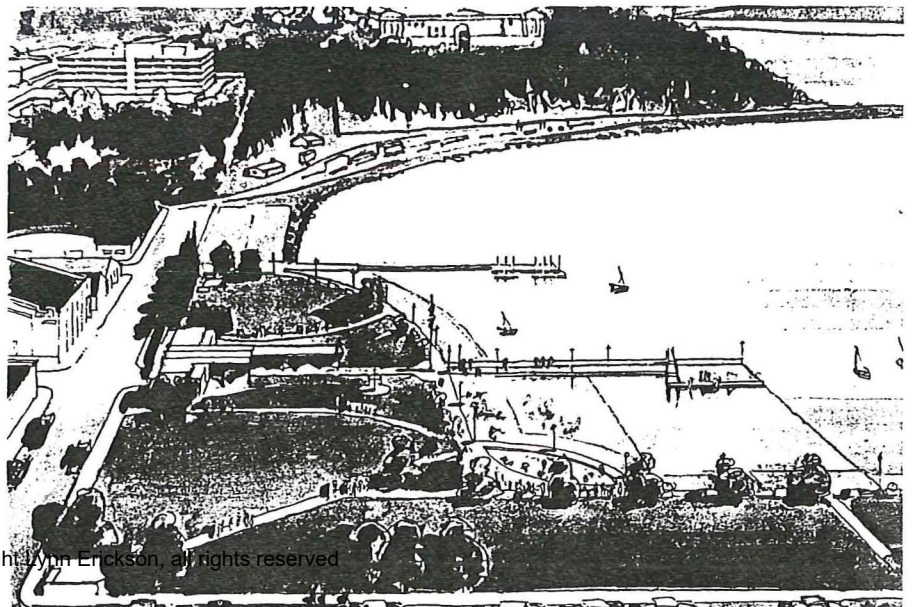
