Whereupon the above mentioned Trustees elect, met at the office of the Town Clerk on Tuesday April 11th at 7 1/2 o'clock P.M. and having duly qualified according to law proceeded to organize.

The election of President being in order, Mr Murphy nominated Mr Henry and Mr Percival nominated Mr Steele,

Whereupon Mr Henry having ^{received} a majority of the vote cast was declared elected President of the Board.
