EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2004 the City of Olympia authorized the Olympia Heritage Commission to undertake a review of the City's historic preservation program and to recommend preservation priorities for the next several years. This report summarizes the findings of the Commission and offers a comprehensive "roadmap" to guide future preservation policies, planning and programs which will revitalize and strengthen the Historic Preservation program of Olympia.

The 2004 Olympia Historic Preservation Plan consists of four distinct elements.
